Magic City Kiwanis Pancake Breakfast on Saturday, May 3rd, held in conjunction with the Barberton Jaycees Cherry Blossom Parade and Festival, found us serving 751 breakfasts, a new record. Kudos go to Wane Goss for overseeing the entire operation. Diane McConnell did a great job with the placemats, which netted us almost five hundred dollars. Larry Bidlingmyer sold many sponsored and pre-sale tickets and the club as a whole really pitched in to make this happen. Over half of our members played some role in making this event a success. The profits should be \$2884.12 if we retain one hundred percent ownership of the grills and related supplies. If the Noon Club decides to share costs, our profits rise to \$3329. Relay For Life Cancer Walk: Noon, Saturday, July 19th, thru noon, Sunday, July 20th, around Lake Anna. Relay For Life is the signature event of the American Cancer Society. Each relay puts the spotlight on cancer survivors of all ages, races, and ethnic backgrounds. Teams of 10 to 15 raise funds so the ACS can fund research, education, advocacy, and services. Team members take turns walking, jogging, or running around the lake during the overnight events. Contests, games, entertainment, raffles, and a number of other activities also take place during the 24-hr period. MCK's team theme is "Pirate's Cove." We would like to have a Kiwanian walking each hour of the relay! If you are unable to walk but still want to participate, signup to help at our base camp. You can purchase a \$10 luminary until 3 PM Saturday, with the name of your choice of someone who has either survived or has been taken by cancer. Other Activities/Items

May 2008, Board Meeting: We will be looking for a volunteer to compile and maintain a scrapbook of the awards the club and members receive. We qualify for one email address from the web page, it will be President@magiccitykiwanis.org; Diane McConnell presented a fund raising idea of the sale of doormats. We approved one thousand dollars for two designs, fifty mats of each. Sale price of the mats to be determined later. Rich M. offered to help with design of the mats. Charles Coffelt was approved as our official delegate to the Kiwanis International Convention and will be authorized to cast a vote in the International election in the name of the club. We will purchase a gift certificate from Casa del Ranchero for Megan Slater for her efforts in design work for club business and present it to her at a morning meeting. A student named America Bohley volunteered at the pancake breakfast doing clean up. We will invite her and a parent to come to a morning meeting some day to thank her, and print up a certificate of appreciation. The purchase of small women's wallets was approved for speaker's gifts. Elizabeth proposed the purchase of O. C. Barber notepapers at \$2 each from the Historical Society also for speaker's gifts but did not have the sample, this was tabled. \$100 was approved for Sports Hall of Fame patron ad; up to \$250 for Safety Town upon presentation of bills; \$300 for luminaries for Relay for Life, \$100 to register walking team for Relay for Life; \$100 for a hole sponsorship for the Kiwanis Ohio District Golf Outing in July; \$250 to St. Augustine Church for use of the hall for pancakes. We will not decide as yet on cashing in our March 8 District Mid-year rebates versus taking a credit for the August 15-16 convention until we see how many plan to attend.

Esther Ryan Shoe Fund: As result of the collection of Acme cash register receipts from September 29, 2007 through February 16, 2008, MCK made a total \$115.95. Acme has cut the products that qualify as well as the period the program is in effect. Bob Guilda, who has handled this fundraiser the past couple of years, feels that it may not be worth the effort in the future.
